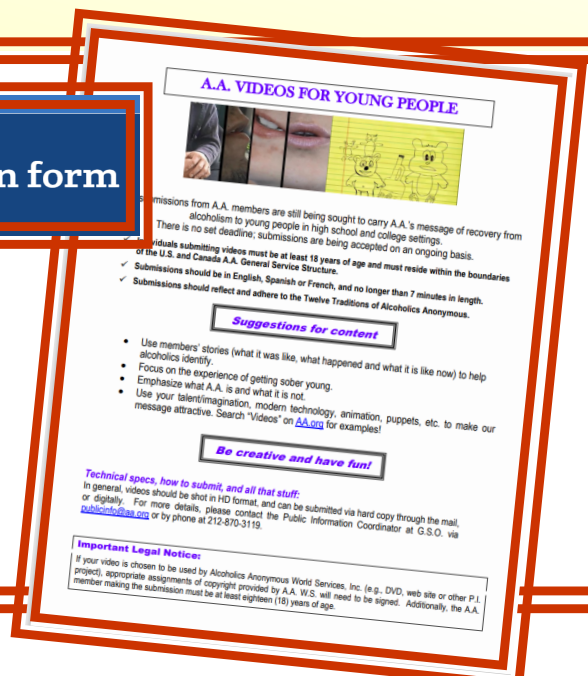

### Safety and A.A. Flyer

A.A. groups are made up of alcoholics who gather for the sole purpose of staying sober and helping other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

Safety is a topic within A.A. that groups and members may need to address to help ensure the ability to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Our Twelve Traditions provide a set of principles to help guide us, and the additional shared experience pertaining specifically to safety provided in this service

#### SAFETY CARD FOR A.A. GROUPS

The General Service Office has made this optional card available as an A.A. service piece for its-personalities groups that wish to use it. Please feel free to utilize, choose a section(s) or adapt the text to your group's needs.

Tradition Five states: Each group has but one primary purpose — to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

Any person seeking help with a drinking problem is welcome at this group. No A.A. entity determines an individual's membership in Alcoholics Anonymous. It is this group's conscience that if any person endangers another individual or disrupts the group's efforts to carry A.A.'s message, the group may ask that person to leave the meeting.

This group strives to safeguard the anonymity of A.A. members and attendees; however, keep in mind that anonymity in A.A. is not a cloak for unsafe and illegal behavior. Addressing such behavior and/or contacting the proper authorities when appropriate, does not go against any A.A. Tradition and is meant to ensure the safety of all in attendance.

The short form of Tradition One states: "Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity." Recognizing the importance of group unity, our group strives to create a safe meeting environment in which alcoholics can focus on achieving sobriety.

#### ***Did you know with have a Technology Committee?***

I did not! Yet, I blissfully attend zoom meetings and go to the meeting guide app when I need to find an extra meeting. All of which require technology to work. With COVID we moved into a technology world rapidly. We pioneered and stumbled through learning a new way to bring AA to everyone remotely. This was the beginning of the realization that we were moving into a new era.

There were other incidents though, like the internet and phone issues at the Red House. A kind AA member with a tech background went to try and find out what was wrong and found the wiring was horribly frayed. As more and more things began to bubble up there was the realization that most AA technology knowledge was in just a few peoples’ heads and very few things were written down.

AAIG’s only Webmaster needed help! AA community members stepped forward to resolve individual issues, but it became clear AAIG needed a Technology Committee to put enduring procedures and processes in place to bring us into the “digital age”. The Committee officially stood up in June 2022.

***Q: Why do AA’s keep attending meetings once they are cured?***

***A: We in A.A. believe there is no such thing as a cure for alcoholism. We can never return to normal drinking, and our ability to stay away from alcohol depends on maintaining our physical, mental, and spiritual health. This we can achieve by going to meetings regularly and putting into practice what we learn there. In addition, we find it helps us to stay sober if we help other alcoholics.***

Yes, AA’s continue because they want to stay sober! And guess what folks we are never cured. But we continue to learn how to navigate life on a daily basis. I am a different person today than I was even six months ago!

Once you put down the bottle Life happens. And what a miracle it is. The first couple of years seemed to mainly consist of stuffing myself with every other possible means of self satisfaction. And feeling supremely guilty and fat; and unworthy of anyone else’s time or love. “But I’m sober” was my mantra and excuse. This is one of the many areas where my patient sponsor helped me navigate. I had to learn not to be so rigidly hard on myself.

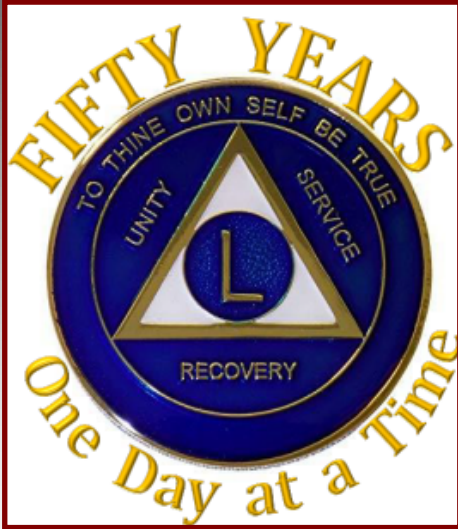
Being the center of my universe for so long was tough to let go of. All those years of “me, me, me.” I am still (only three and a half years sober) working daily, if not hourly, on all my character defects.

Learning to accept help from anyone else was probably one of my toughest hurdles. But I found a wonderful group of women who always have so patiently and kindly been there for me, to hold me up when I need support. The people who have years of sobriety and continue to show up are the ones who encourage the newcomers by showing them the possibility of a better life.

Thank god there is no cure!



# AAIG 50 Years - One Day at a Time!



"THIS IS TO CERTIFY ... on this 25<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1972 ... the foregoing Articles of Incorporation ...".

"...The name of the corporation is ANNAPOLIS AREA INTERGROUP, INCORPORATED ... and it is organized exclusively for furthering the aims of Alcoholics Anonymous and the dissemination of information concerning alcoholism ..."

With these two excerpts from the original Articles, the Annapolis Area Intergroup, Inc. was official!

By January 1973, offices were set up at 169 Duke of Gloucester Street, Annapolis, Maryland, "The Red House" and opened for business.

In its early years of operation, it is reported that a half a dozen to a dozen persons a day would visit AAIG. Once Beginner's meetings were established and other AA Groups began to use the Red House, the number of visitors to AAIG grew and grew.

Fifty years later, AAIG still has its offices at this location. The pandemic did provide challenges, reducing visitation and meetings, yet, AAIG continued to provide services during the height of the virus.

The primary service provided at the Red House is the AAIG phone answering service. Here volunteers respond to general inquiries and most importantly to the alcoholic in need. The location is also used to store and sell AA literature. It also has its use as a business office for the coordination of AAIG's other Intergroup services.



As per AA Intergroups across the globe, AAIG provides a variety of services to keep area AA's and area service partners (public and private) interconnected and informed. These services include the publication of a monthly bulletin, periodic printing and distribution of *Where and When* meeting guides, and carrying the message to persons in correctional and rehabilitation facilities.

AAIG does not sponsor AA meetings, yet, AA and AA Beginner Groups have resumed weekly meetings in the facility. In addition, the landlord (the First Presbyterian Church) makes space available adjacent to the Red House which AA Groups and AAIG use for meetings, workshops and other activities.

Looking back to 1972, special thanks go to the original steering committee, the 29 participating AA Group Intergroup representatives, and the other trusted servants that brought AAIG into existence.

In the last couple years, due to the unforeseen circumstances of the pandemic, AA was forced to move rapidly into the virtual world. And move we did! There are now about a dozen virtual meetings held weekly in the Annapolis Area. Additionally, AAIG meetings are held virtually, as do Annapolis Area Districts.

Looking forward, AAIG's trusted servants are committed to serve the alcoholic that still struggles. Through service, AAIG wants the hand of AA to always be there.

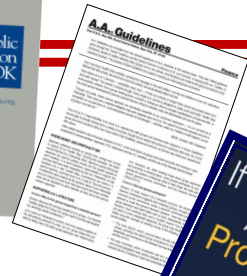
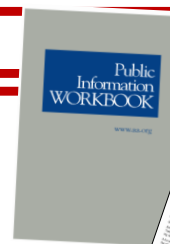

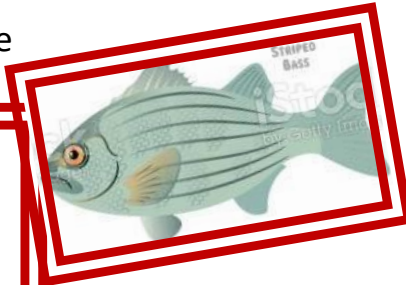
